- Water conditions in this area are subject to change without further notice. Life jackets should be worn at all times when entering the lakes or the river below Gantt and Point A dams. To ensure your safety, follow all posted signs pertaining to the lakes and PowerSouth's Recreational Facilities.
- The generation schedule for PowerSouth's hydroelectric dams and subsequent water releases are subject to change without notice.
- Areas above and below the dams are hazardous due to turbulent water conditions. Be alert at all times for changing water levels and water conditions such as strong undercurrents and turbulent or swirling water. Water currents are unpredictable.
- Hours of operation are from dawn to dusk. No overnight camping is allowed.

- PowerSouth's Recreational Facilities are not to be used for any immoral or illegal purpose. These facilities are intended for wholesome recreational uses only. They may also not be used for commercial purposes.
- Do not use any fireworks, fire pits, explosives of flammable devices at PowerSouth's Recreational Facilities.
- **Never** approach the dam or powerhouse.
- Beware of submerged hazards, slippery surfaces and rapidly rising water.
- Obey all boating safety laws.
